No 6 of the aforesaid Parish being under bidding from his wife
I found and have thought proper to make my last will
and for the love & affection that I bear towards my beloved
daughter Mary Martha of English after all my just & due
lawful debts are paid I will and bequeath unto her daughter
all of my property namely Sixty Negroes my plantation
in Christ Church Parish all my cattle one hundred
more or less Horses Chores one mule my Stock of Sheep
Stock of Goats Stock of Hogs my Lodge and all my plantation
Utensils I leave this property to be sold and monies aforesaid
in Stock the interest of which is to be paid over to my said
daughter for her use until married when if wife shall
beiam Capers she will be entitled to principal & interest
her heirs Assignees forever But should she marry belling
Capers only entitled to the interest until her death and
then issue or no issue the whole property to be divided
equally between John D English Mary Ann Your
Wife of Chas Doar Thomas Marie and William Marie
their heirs and Executors forever My said daughter Martha
may reserve for herself any two of my negroes to wait upon her
or their value in money provided she does not marry against
my will as aforesaid And by this

papers only entitled to the interest until her death and
then issue or no issue the whole property to be divided
equally between John DeL'English Mary Ann Doar
wife of Chas Doar Thomas Maree and William Maree
their heirs and executors forever. My said daughter Martha
may reserve for herself any two of my negroes to wait upon her
or their value in money provided she does not marry against
my will as aforesaid And furthermore I wish to give to
Mary Brown (a colored woman) One hundred dollars
and one Cow and half also to Patsy Brown (a colored
woman) one hundred dollars one cow & calf and to
Handy Brown ten dollars. To all three of the last
mentioned persons I leave twenty acres of land (bounding
on the creek) with the buildings thereon for life Furthermore
I appoint John DeLong & the McManigault my Executor
This is my last will and testament witness my
hand & seal
