State of South Carolina. In the Name of God Amen  
I George George Campbell of the City of Charleston and State  
aforesaid being of sound mind Memory and Understanding do  
declare this my last will and Testament In manner and form  
following that is to say. I will and devise that all my just debts  
and funeral expenses shall be paid as soon as possible after my  
decease by my Executors Hereinafter to be named as may qualify  
on this my last will and Testament. I give & devise  
all my Estate of whatsoever it may consist and wherever the same  
may be situated to my Executors upon this special Trust &  
confidence, that is to say in Trust that they will sell and  
dispose of my Estate within twelve months after my decease or  
sooner if convenient, that is to say that they will dispose of  
sum beyond names of Mrs. Tom, Frederickus, James, Ben,  
Richard, and Charles, one third of the purchase money  
to be paid down in cash and for the Balance of the said  
purchase they shall take bonds or notes payable in 12 and  
twelve months with interest from the day of sale. the property

to be secured by Mortgage and personal security, and  
upon the further trust and confidence that such of my  
Executors as may qualify on this my last will & Testament  
shall and will make Executoe and Admino Bonds and suffic-  
ient Fides and conveyances to all and every person or person  
who shall or may become the Purchaser of the said Estate  
and that they will get in and receive all sums of money  
which may be due or owing on the bonds or notes to be  
taken by them from the Purchaser of the said Estate,  
and upon the further Trust and confidence that they  
will out of the proceeds of the said Estate duly devised  
to them as soon as they shall be in funds from the  
said Estate pay and discharge all and singular the  
Legacies and bequests hereinafter to be contained to all  
such Persons as may under this my last will & Testament  
be Intitled thereto! Item: I give and Bequeath to  
George Robertson the son of my Friend John Robertson  
the present Navy Agent of the United States residing in  
Charleston the Sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars. But  
should the said George Robertson die before he shall  
attain the age of Twenty One years, then I give and

attain the age of twenty one years, then I give and bequeath the said sum of fifteen hundred Dollars to his said Father John Robertson to be disposed of in such manner, as he the said John Robertson shall think fit; Item: I give the bequeath to George Campbell Rearr of the United States Navy and to his Executors and Administrators Two hundred shares out of my Stocks in the Banks of the United States, Likewise all Lots of ground in the City of Washington, all my shares in the Washington Bridge Company, all my silver and my jewels; Item: I give to Doctor George Logan of Charleston a pew in St. Pauls Church designated by No. 94 and my horse; Item: I give the bequeath to Mary Logan the wife of G. M. Logan of Charleston Five hundred Dollars. Item: I give the bequeath to Mrs. Tucker Mother of Charles Tucker and Mrs. Sumner of Charleston Five hundred Dollars. Item: The Residue of my Estate I give and bequeath to my Niece Catharine Etheld Campbell of the County down Ireland at present residing in the Isle of Man, And lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my Friends James Logan Thomas P. Bacon and John Robertson (Mary Agents) of Charleston the Executors of this my last Will and Testaments, Hugh S. Campbell
