satisfied I give devise and bequeath in manner and form following the

1 is to say I do hereby give and bequeath unto my Plegge
named Tom his freedom for ever immediately after my death. I do
my Will and desire that my House and Lot situate lying and being
in King's Street and known and distinguished by the (No 132) one hun-
dred and thirty two and the shed wherein I reside and all the rest
residue and remainder of my Estate both real and personal be sold by
my Executor herein after named immediately after my decease who is
hereby authorized and empowered to make and execute good and suffi-
cient titles to the said Lot of Land and the improvements thereon, and
that the monies arising from the sale thereof as well as that which may
arise from the sales of my personal Estate and Bonds, notes, books of
accounts, Bank shares or of and from any other specialties whatsoever
be divided amongst my two brothers and sister, residing in Amsterdam
named Joseph, c Mordeica and c Malacki Cohen, or the survivor, or
survivors of them share and share alike, and to them and each of their
heirs forever. Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint c
John Bulow of Charleston c Merchant Executor of this my last
Will and Testament hereby revoking all former and other Wills by
me made and declaring this only to be my last Will. In Witness
whereof I the said Jacob Cohen have to this my said Will set my
hand and seal this the nineteenth day of c May in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and in the twenty fourth Year
of the Sovereignty and Independence of the united States of America
