Will and Testament in manner and form follow-

just and lawful debts be paid and satisfied by my
Executor hereinafter mentioned. Item it was the
desire of my late husband John Stevenson, by his
last Will and Testament, that all his just and lawful
debts should be paid and satisfied, but finding the in-
come of his Estate insufficient to satisfy the demands
against his Estate, and wherewithall to supply my want
in my distress, under the interposing hand of provid-
ence, my friends gave me assistance, and with my
own industry and economy I was enabled to satisfy
the demands against his Estate, and supply my
wants, by those means, the property which would have
I kept from being sold, which consequently would have
been the case if those assistances and means were with-
held, I do therefore consider myself intitled to all the

property which my late husband left by his Will when he died, I do therefore give devise and bequeath unto my loving Son Thomas Stevenson all my Estate both real and personal which I have thus acquired, as also what I have acquired since the death of my late husband, and all which I shall be possessed of at the time of my death, also the annual supply of one keep from the stock of cattle which was left me by my late husband, which are now (or hereafter may be) due me, three only of which I have ever received, also the following articles which are now in the possession of William Lane (to wit) one large hair trunk, one corn mill, a large iron pot, one pair smoothing irons, four silver table spoons and a dressing table to him and his heirs for ever. Lastly I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my loving Son Thomas Stevenson my Executor to execute this my last Will and Testament.
