 body and if in case my Brother John Wm Bollaugh should die
 and leaving no such heir that the property shall return & be Equally
 divided between my Brother James Dewa Whilden and my Will
 and desire is the money which Mr Elias Whilden Sr^r owes me, say
 four hundred and fifty Dollars shall be for the purpose of buying
 a young negro man, and last of all I appoint my wife Eliza Bollaugh
 Executor and my friends Joseph Fairgair and Benjamin Whitesides
 Executors to this my last Will and Testament as above mention When

which I fear will prove my last, but of sound mind, memory and
understanding do hereby make my last Will and Testament in manner
and form following that is to say: I hereby give and bequeath to my daugh-
ter Hester or Betty Moss, a certain two story wooden dwelling house
