N. 4. City of Charleston being sick and weak of body but of sound and disposing
mind and memory (thanks be to God for the same, and deeply considering my
Mortality and knowing that it is Ordered and appointed for all men once to
die, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs while I have strength and
capacity so to do, do make ordain and publish this my last Will and testa-
ment, hereby revoking and making void all former Wills by me at any time her-
etofore made First and principally I commit my Soul into the hands of my Creator
who gave it, and my body to the Earth to be buried with decent solemnity without
show or ostentation at the discretion of my Executors to be hereinafter named, as
as to such worldly Estate wherewith it hath been pleased God to intrust me I
dispose of the same as follows. In primis it is my Will and desire that all my
Just debts be paid out of such Accounts debts and demands which may be due
and owing to me at the time of my death, as soon as my Executors may in their
discretion think convenient, It is my Will and desire and I do hereby devise
and bequeath to my respected Mother Mrs Phillis Campbell and to my beloved
Sister Mary Campbell the House and Lot in Queen Street designated by the (N.
85) Number eighty five bounded on the West by a Lot of Joseph Bates, on the North by
bounded on the East by the Lot of Row and and on the
South by Queen Street aforesaid, the said House and Lot being given under the
following limitations to wit to my Mother Phillis Campbell during the term of
her natural life and to my Sister Mary Campbell to her and her heirs and assigns

South by Queen Street aforesaid, the said House and Lot being given under the following limitations to wit to my Mother Phillis Campbell during the term of her natural life and to my Sister Mary Campbell to her and her heirs and assigns to hold the same in equal Moieties or Shares during the life of my said Mother as Joint Tenants and not as tenants in Common, and it is my Will and desire that at the death of my said Mother (an event which I hope and trust is still at a great distance of time) then her moiety or share which she held in the said House and Lot shall immediately vest in, and go to my Sister Sarah Campbell, to her and her Heirs and Assigns, And it is also my Will and desire that in case my said Sister Mary Campbell should depart this life without Heirs of her body lawfully begotten then it is my Will that the half or moiety held by her shall vest in and immediately go, and belong to my aforesaid Sister Sarah Campbell to her and to her Heirs and Assigns for ever, she becoming by this means sole and alone owner, and proprietor, of the entire House and Lot as before described and mentioned and the moieties aforesaid being now joined in her, and to her and to her Heirs for ever And it is my Will and Desire that all the Debts due demands Choses in Action and claims of and belonging to that part of my Estate left as a fund for the payment of my Debts by my Executors as aforesaid after deducting therefrom what amount or sum which at the time of my death I may owe or may be indebted, shall all be fairly and equally divided between my said Mother Phillis Campbell and my sister Mary Campbell in even portions share and share alike to be by them disposed

and such as they may think fit And as to my Negroes which I now have or
may have at the time of my decease It is my Will wish and desire that my
Mother may retain one half of them during her life that their labour or the
proceeds thereof may contribute to her convenience and Comforts untill it shall
please God to call her from this world and then the said Negroes to wit one
half of their number shall then become the property of my said Sister Sarah
Campbell; her Sister Mary Campbell holding her half of the negroes and divi-
ding with my Mother in the first instance at the time of my death Mary
taking one half and my Mother retaining one half of the said Negroes untill
her death as aforesaid, And after the Death of my Mother my said Sisters hold-
ing their equal shares of the said Negroes and to be by them enjoyed and
disposed of so as to become in their own opinion most conducive to their support
and Interest and at the death of either of them to go to their heirs or legal re-
presentatives as the case may be, but in case of the death of either of them
without lawful Children to them born, then their share or so much thereof as
shall be and remain at that time undisposed of, or unsold, shall pass into
the hands and possession of the survivor of them which ever may live the longest,
or their surviving heirs, or Children lawfully begotten of their bodies as aforesaid
and all my personal Estate shall be divided and shared the same way in
fair and equal distributions so as to make my negroes and residuary Estate
pass into the hands of my Mother and Sisters and be retained afterwards in
the manner and under the same limitations as the House and Lot before men-
tioned And I do hereby certify that the foregoing is the true and correct

the manner and under the same limitations as the house and lot before men-
tioned, And I do hereby nominate and appoint my friends William H.
Gilliland and Robert Cagar jointly and severally Executors of this my last Will
and Testament and so as that in case of the death of one of them the sur-
vivor shall then be the sole Executor of this my last Will having the utmost
confidence in their Integrity skill and Judgement that they both know what is
right and that they both will do it In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and affixed my Seal this Twenty first day of September in the Year of
our Lord One thousand eight hundred and Eighteen
