In the Name of God Amen, I James Muirhead of the City of Charleston, in the State aforesaid Merchant, being sick and weak of body, but of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, do make and ordain, this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following, vizt. first and principally I recommend my soul to God, who gave it and my body I commit to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner in the discretion of my Executors herein after named, and as for and concerning the worldly Estate, wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me, I will and dispose thereof in manner following vizt. secondly my Will and desire is, that all my just debts and funeral expences be fully paid and satisfied, and in order thereto, and for the better distribution of my Estate in the manner and form herein after particularly mentioned, I order and direct that all my Estate both real and personal, whatsoever and wheresoever, be sold by my Executors aforesaid at any time after my decease, at public or private sale, for cash or on credit, in the discretion of my said Executors. Thirdly

101 I give and bequeath unto my friend John c Munro of Charleston Watch maker, the sum of two hundred dollars to purchase mourning for himself and family. fourthly I give and bequeath unto my Nephew James Muirhead the sum of seven hundred and fifty pounds sterling, and after the same is paid, I give and bequeath unto Jane Munro the eldest daughter of my said friend John c Munro, the sum of two hundred and fifty pounds sterling and after the payment of the aforesaid legacies. I give the sum of two thousand pounds sterling in equal moieties, one moiety thereof unto my said Nephew James c Muirhead, and the other moiety unto Jane c Munro the aforesaid daughter of my friend John c Munro, but in case my Estate should after payment of my debts and funeral expenses, amount to three thousand pounds sterling or upwards, then and in that case, I give devise and bequeath all my Estate both real and personal, whatsoever and wheresoever, over and above payment of the preceding legacies, in equal moieties, one thereof unto my said Nephew James c Muirhead and the other moiety unto all the Children of my said friend John c Munro by his Wife c M^{rs} Margaret c Munro, who are now living and to the survivors and survivors of the said Children until some one of them shall attain the age of twenty one years or day of marriage which ever shall first happen and

from, and immediately after that contingency,
to the Children of the said John C. Munro and
Margaret his Wife, and the survivors and survivors
of them share and share alike. fifthly, I ordain
and direct that all the debts due me shall be
collected and got in, and the real and personal
Estate of which I am possessed, interested in, and
intitled unto, be disposed of as soon as conveniently
may be after my decease, and that the
monies arising from, and produced thereby
shall be laid out in the stock of the bank of
South Carolina, or if that cannot be conveniently
done, or if in the opinion of my Executors qual-
lified for the time being, or a majority of them
it appeared to be injurious to the interests of
my legatees, then in the purchase of such
other productive funds, or property real or per-
sonal, as the said majority of my Executors qual-
lified for the time being, shall think proper
and expedient, the profits only of the bank
shares, funds or property aforesaid, to be
applied to the nurture, maintenance, and
education of my several legatees aforesaid, and
the principal, in whatever the same may con-
sist to be paid them, as they respectively
shall attain the age of twenty one years or are
married. Lastly I truly nominate, constitute and
appoint my friends David Haig, John Duffus
and Andrew Gow, and David Bailey of Charle-
ston aforesaid Executors, of this my Will and Testa-
ment, hereby revoking, and making null and void
all other Wills by me heretofore made, declaring this
alone to be and contain my last Will and Testa-
ment. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal at Charleston the sixth day of
January in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and one.
