 No 12 of the City of Maiseelles aged Sixty six years,  
 Doctor residing in the City of Charleston sick in body but  
 sound in mind memory and understanding wishing to settle  
 my affairs in case it should be Gods will to dispose of  
 my body do make dictate & sign this present my will with-  
 out persuation or Suggestion and of my own free Will as  
 follows. I name and leave as my Legatee general Mr Fran-  
 cis Carmand Merchant Tailor residing in this City of  
 Charleston my friend, it is my will and pleasure that  
 whatsoever shall be found belonging to me after my death  
 in whatever it may consist be his property and no person  
 may disturb him in it, and this in gratitude for favours  
 confer'd at different times. And to execute this present  
 my will I name and Choose Mr Francis Carmand whom I en-  
 treat to do me this Last favour making Void all Wills An-  
 terior to this which is the only good, done in Charleston  
 the fifth of April one thousand Eight hundred and twenty  
 Seven.
