make my last Will and Testament in manner and form following
First, It is my will and desire, that all my just and lawful debts
shall be paid by my Executor hereinafter named, as soon as it
can be conveniently done after my decease. Item. I give devise
and bequeath to my brothers Henry Frederick Faber and Joseph
William Faber all my wearing apparel and Books, to be divided between
and given to them in such manner and at such time or times, as
my Father John b. Faber Senr the Elder shall determine. Item. I give
devise and bequeath all my Funded Stock and Bank Stock to my
Father in Trust as follows. One fourth thereof shall be transferred by
him to my sister Maria Christina Faber, to belong to her and her Heirs and
assigns forever; One other Fourth shall be transferred by him to my
brother in law Isaac S. K. Bennett Esq. in trust for his wife Catharine
Elizabeth Bennett; another fourth shall be held by my father in trust
for my brother Henry Frederick Faber, until he shall arrive to the age of
Twenty one years; and another fourth shall be held by my father in
trust for my brother Joseph William Faber, until he shall arrive to the
age of twenty one years, But if there should remain one or more odd
Bank Shares which cannot be transferred to my brothers and Sisters
as aforesaid, I do hereby order such odd Share or Shares to be sold,
and the proceeds thereof to be

my Father John b. Faber ~~the~~ the Elder shall determine. Item. I give
devise and bequeath all my Funded Stock and Bank Stock to my
Father in Trust as follows. One fourth thereof shall be transferred by
him to my Sister Maria Christina Faber, to belong to her and her Heirs and
assigns forever. One other Fourth shall be transferred by him to my
Brother in law Isaac S. K. Bennett Esq. in trust for his wife Catharine
Elisabeth Bennett; another fourth shall be held by my father in trust
for my brother Henry Frederick Faber, until he shall arrive to the age of
Twenty one years; and another fourth shall be held by my father in
Trust for my brother Joseph William Faber, until he shall arrive to the
age of twenty one years, But if there should remain one or more odd
Bank Shares which cannot be transferred to my brothers and Sisters
as aforesaid, I do hereby order such odd share or shares to be sold,
and the proceeds thereof to be divided equally between my Brothers
and Sisters. Item. I do hereby authorize my Father to exchange the
Funded ^{or Bank} and Bank Stock or either thereof, which he shall and may
hold for my two brothers or either of them as aforesaid, for other Funded
Stock or Bank Stock, in such manner and on such terms as he
from time to time may deem proper. and I do also give similar
power and authority to my Brother in law Isaac S. K. Bennett to exchange
the funded Stock and Bank Stock, which he shall hold in Trust for his
wife Catharine Elisabeth Bennett as aforesaid, for other Funded Stock

or Bank Stock in Trust for his said wife. Item I give and devise
that if either of my two brothers should die under age, leaving no
lawful issue, that his portion of my Estate with the Interest accrued thereon
shall be ^{equally} divided between his surviving brother and sister. I do
hereby ^{constitute} nominate and appoint my Father John C. Faber the Elder
an Executor of this my last will and testament declaring him from
all responsibility concerning the management of my Estate. In
witness whereof I have hereunto put my hands and seal at Charleston
this tenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and sixteen.
