No. 18, sick in body, however sound in mind, memory, judgment and
understanding, but uncertain, as every individual may be, of the

100. moment of death and wishing to arrange my temporal affairs,
I have made and dictated the present my testament and act of
my last Will, without neither seduction nor instigation of any
person and of my own accord, thus and in the manner as
follows: First, I recommend my soul to God the everlasting Fa-
ther, I supplicate him to forgive all the sins I may have com-
mitted in this lower world and going from this into the
next to be so kind as to cause it to enjoy the everlasting righte-
ousness of Heaven. Secondly, (My debts being paid if there are any)

De Norroy that she may enjoy and dispose of it as she may think
proper and finally as of her own personal property. I annul, set
aside every other Will or codicil I might have made before this
present as this including my last Will, in the contents of
