should so happen that my dear Child should
marry before such division should take place
that then in such case my Wife shall have
one whole year to make such division and
payment of her daughter Elenor Clarks part
of my Estate above mentioned. Item I will
that my Nephew John Clark shall continue
as heretofore with my dear Wife and after
she shall have given him one years schooling
to put him to a trade such as he may choose
and in case that Nancy and her Issue should
live until he comes of age then I will that my
dear Wife shall give him a Negro Wench or
an equivalent at his choice. Item and I do hereby
make and appoint my dear and beloved
Wife sole Executrix to this my last Will and
Testament hereby revoking and annulling
all other Wills heretofore made and constituting
