In the Name of God Amen. I John Dutant of St. James parish, <sup>Santa</sup> <sup>Florida</sup>  
do make this my last Will, in manner and form following. I give  
to my wife Martha the use of the negroes I got by her, <sup>namely</sup> Elsey, Susanna,  
and Lickey during her life and at her death to be equally divided a-  
mong her children. I give to my wife Martha the use of the Plantation  
where I now reside, which I purchased from Alexander Chovin, during  
the time she remains my widow, and at her marriage or death, to  
return to my Estate. I give to my wife Martha, her choice of one of  
horses, my riding chair and harness, one bedstead, one feather bed,  
one mattress, one pair of Sheets, one Pillow, one Bolster, two Blankets, all  
my tea galls, all my household furniture, and Kitchen furniture,  
all my brockery and glassware; and an equal share with my chil-  
dren, of cattle, hogs, and sheep, pigs, or live & Down. As my land  
cannot be divided to any advantage, it is my desire that it be kept

the use of my Estate until my youngest child arrives at the age of Twenty  
one year or marries, and then to be sold and the money to be equally  
divided among my children. I give my surplus and all other property  
which I have not mentioned above, to my children share and share alike  
each child to draw his or her share, as they arrive at the age of Twenty  
one year or marry. I nominate and appoint William Gaillard,  
James E. Jernan, and David Gaillard Executors to this my last Will  
and Testament. Witness my hand and seal this sixteenth day of October  
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen.
