In the Name of God Amen, I John Gaillard of St James Parish Santee, in the State aforesaid Planter being Well in body and of tranquil mind do make publish and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my Son Peyre Gaillard

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and unto his heirs and assigns for ever, all that my Plantation
tract of land (exclusive of the one called Perdreau's) which I bought of
M^r Charles Drake being in St. James Parish containing between
seven and eight hundred acres, and my Will is that my daughters
Lydia, & Mary and Louisa be permitted to work and employ their
Negroes on the above plantation during their Minority or while
they remain single. Item It is my Will and I do hereby di-
rect that my Executors do immediately after my death pay
over to each of my daughters Elizabeth, Lydia, & Mary and
Louisa, the sum of seven hundred pounds sterling or the
value thereof in Negroes, accounting those five Negroes I have let
my daughter Elizabeth have of the following names, viz Cla-
rissa, Susy, Caesar, Tommy and Venus, and valued at three
hundred and thirty five pounds sterling, as in part of the seven
hundred pounds to be paid her as above, Item it is my Will
that all the rest residue and remainder of my lands where-
soever they may lay (those at Lewisville in St. Thomas Pa-
rish excepted) shall be sold by my Executors herein after
named, on such terms either at public or private sale as they
shall deem most advantageous for my Estate; and that the pro-
ceeds thereof shall be taken and deemed as personal Estate, and
shall go and be disposed of in the same manner as the resi-
due of my Estate herein after mentioned. Item It is my Will
and I do hereby give and devise my Plantation at Lewisville
in Saint Thomas Parish lately purchased from the
Estate of Natham Lart, together with the bedding and hous-
hold furniture appertaining thereto, unto my three daughters
Lydia, & Mary and Louisa, and their Aunt & Miss Floride
Peyre, each of my three daughters above named, and & Miss Peyre
to hold her share of or interest in the same, as long as she
shall remain single, and as soon as she shall marry or die,
her share of, or interest in the same shall go to and rest in
my surviving daughters or daughter and & Miss Peyre it being
my intention that the said Plantation shall be a residence
for such of my three daughters and & Miss Peyre as shall

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remain single or unmarried. Item I hereby give and bequeath
to Miss Floride Peyre during her natural life my yellow girl
Elsey and my waiting boy Prince, and after the marriage of
my three daughters herein mentioned, or their and Miss Peyre's
death that is after all the Interests in the said Plantation, and
girl Elsey and boy Prince shall have ceased, it is my Will
that the said Plantation and girl Elsey and boy Prince
shall be sold by my Executors or Executor or such of them as
may qualify and act on my Will, and the moneys arising there-
from, I give to be equally divided among such of my Children
as shall be then living, or the Children or Child of such
as shall be then dead, standing in the place of, or representing
his or her deceased parent. Item I give to my daughter Lydia
her Exors, Administrators and assigns a negro girl Binah, to
my daughter Mary her Exors, Admins and assigns a Negro
girl Molly, to my daughter Louisa her Exors Admins and
assigns a negro girl Monimia. Item It is my Will that all
the residue of my personal Estate wheresoever and whatsoever,
(the Wench Grace and her Issue excepted) shall be equally divi-
ded between my Children John, Theodore, Peyre, Elizabeth,
Lydia, Mary and Louisa, that my Sons shall hold their
proportions of my personal Estate to them, and their several
Executors, Administrators and assigns for ever, that my daugh-
ters shall hold their several proportions of my Estate during
their several lives free from and not subject or liable to the debts,
charges or incumbrances, or the controul, interference or inter-
meddling of their or either of their respective husbands, and
on their respective deaths the same shall go and descend to
such Child or Children as they may severally leave living
at their respective deaths, to be equally divided between them,
if more than one share and share alike, and for default of

47 such I give them the same, shall go, to, and vest in the husband
of my daughter, so dying, if he, shall be living at the time of
her death. Lastly I do hereby nominate, constitute, and ap-
point my Sons John Gaillard, Theodore Gaillard, and Pyre
Gaillard and my brother Theodore Gaillard Executors of this my
last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void
all other and former Wills by me at any time heretofore made.
