

208. In the Name of God Amen. I John Heywards of Saint Lukes Par-
ish in the District of Beaufort and State of South Carolina, Planter, being
N^o 49. of a sound and disposing mind memory and understanding
thanks be to God for the same, but considering the uncertainty of
human life do therefore make this my last Will and Testament
in manner and form following, that is to say, I give and bequeath
to my niece Mrs Ann Heyward (the wife of my Cousin Thomas
Heyward) and to my nephews James, Thomas, John Alexander,
and George, the children of General John A. Buttbart, the Sum of
One thousand Pounds to each of them, to be paid out of my Estate
in three years after my decease, free of Interest. Also I give and
bequeath to my brother Josias Heyward and to his heirs and assigns
forever Twenty five Negro Slaves, to be drawn by lot in families, to
be appraised out of the gang of Negroes I got by my father's
Estate, but if in drawing the said Lots, he should draw more
than the number of twenty five negroes, Then it is my Will
that he shall pay the value of the over proportion intended for
him to my Executors hereinafter named to be paid by them to my
brother William Heyward's children equally between them. It
being my intention not to separate Families. Also, I give,
devise and bequeath to my dear Sister Mrs Margaret Glover (the
wife of Wilson Glover Esquire) my Fishers Hill Plantation situate
in St Lukes Parish containing 2000 Acres of Land

devise and bequeath to my dear Sister Mrs Margaret Glover (the
wife of Wilson Glover Esquire) my Fishers Hill Plantation situate
in St. Lukes Parish, containing one thousand five hundred
and fifty three Acres, more or less, together with the horses and
stock of every description belonging to that place, Waggon, carts
and Implements of Husbandry. Also my two tracts of Land
called Richfield and Fairfield adjoining together, situated at
the Great Swamp on the Purysburgh Road, also a tract of land
containing two hundred Acres attached to those Plantations, situ-
ated at the Eight Mile Swamp on the Purysburgh Road, together
with the Stock of cattle belonging to those Places. Also my moiety
or half part of an undivided tract of land, situate on the Great
Swamp in Saint Bartholomews Parish containing Four hundred
and three Acres more or less, possessed jointly between the Estate
of Doctor William Webb and myself. Also my House and lot in the
city of Charleston, situate on the North side of Tradd Street. Also
my Pew in Saint Michaels Church No 50. Together with all the
negroes with the increase of the Females, which I got from my
Cousin John Heyward Junr's Estate: also ^{all} my Horses, Carriages, Furniture
Plate, and all my moveables that may be at Sick Town for and
during the term of her natural life, and with this privilege that
she may notwithstanding her coverture and as if she was a free

Sole, by any Instrument of writing, purporting to be her last Will
and Testament duly executed give and dispose of the aforesaid prop-
erty both real and personal to such persons and in such
manner, as she may think proper. But in default of such Will
or disposition aforesaid, or that the same cannot be legally sub-
stantiated so as to give effect to my intentions as aforesaid, Then
from and immediately after her decease, I give all the aforesaid
Property as well real as personal to my nephew John Heyward
Llover and my niece Mrs Ann F. Huger (the wife of Mr John
Huger) equally between them, share and share alike, as tenants
in common and not as joint tenants their heirs and assigns
forever. Also I give and bequeath to my said Sister Margaret
Llover, the crops now on hand at the Fisher's Hill Plantation,
after payment of her proportion of my debts, together with all
Bonds, Notes and accounts, due and owing to me, and all
my ready money, for her own separate use and disposal.
(Also I give devise and bequeath to my niece Anne Heyward
and to my Nephews William, ^{Thomas} John, and Daniel (the children
of my Dear Brother William Heyward) my Walnut Grove Plan-
tation situate in Saint Luke's parish containing One thousand
and two acres more or less together with the Horses and Stock
of every description belonging to that place, Waggon, carts, and

and two acres more or less together with the Horses and Cattle
of every description belonging to that place, Waggon, carts, and
implements of Husbandry. Also another tract of land adjoining
thereto, containing Eight hundred and fifteen acres: also my
mowty or half part of two tracts of land, situate on Satchell's
swamp in Prince William's parish, containing One thousand
Acres which land was possessed by me jointly with my Brother
William Hayward. Also my plantation called Buck Hall, but for-
mally called the old Cuthbert plantation, containing five hundred
acres more or less, situate in Saint Luke's parish. Also the rest and
residue of the negro Slaves with the Increase of the Females, which I
got by my Father's Estate, to them their heirs and assigns forever, equally
between them share and share alike, but in case of the death of
either of them, before my niece attains the age of Eighteen years
and my Nephews the age of Twenty one years, then it is my Will
that the ^{share} shares of them so dying should go to the survivors or survivor
their heirs and assigns forever. Also the crops now on hand at the
Watnold Green Plantation I give and bequeath to my niece Anne
and my Nephews William, Thomas, John and Daniel the children
of my brother William Hayward as aforesaid, after paying their propo-
tion of my debts equally between them. And as to any other Estate
which I may die possessed of, not herein particularly devised and

210. bequeathed, either real or personal I give to my Sister Mrs. Margaret Glover her heirs and assigns forever. And lastly I do hereby name, make and appoint my dear Sister Margaret Glover Executor and my Friends Wilson Glover Esquire, General John Alexander Buttrick John Hays Esquire, and my Nephews John Heyward Glover James Buttrick and William M. Heyward when he attains the age of Twenty one years, Executors of this my last Will and Testament. Herby revoking and making void, all Wills at any time heretofore made by me, declaring ^{only} this to be and contain my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hands and Seal to this my Will, written on two Sheets of Paper, this Fifth day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fourteen. John Heyward  signed sealed published and declared by the said Testator as and for his last Will and Testament in the presence of us, who in the presence of each other and at his request subscribed our names as Witnesses hereto: James Heyward. Edward W. North. Geo. Taylor. Charleston September 30. 1819. Whereas by my last Will and Testament duly made and executed and bearing date the fifth day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fourteen, now of force and unrevoked I bequeathed (out of the property derived from my father's estate) twenty five negroes to my brother Josias Heyward and did then and there

February in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and
fourteen, now of force and unrevoked I bequeathed (out of the
property derived from my father's estate) twenty five negroes to
my brother Josias Heywards and did therein direct in what
manner the said negroes should be ascertained and allotted
and. Whereas it has pleased the Almighty to take the said Josias
Heywards from this life and to frustrate my wishes in his behalf,
Now therefore that his children may enjoy the benefit of the said
bequest, I do hereby declare this to be a codicil of my Last Will
and testament and to be taken as a part thereof. I do hereby revoke
the said bequest to the said Josias Heywards and do bequeath the
said twenty five negroes to be divided share and share alike with
the issue of the females, if any, among the children of the said
Josias Heywards, to wit, Charlotte, Daniel, Thomas & Joanna, at
the following periods, to wit, as the female children shall arrive at the
age of twenty one years, or be married, and as the males shall arrive
at the age of twenty one years. And it is my Will that if either of
the children of the said Josias Heywards shall depart this life before
the time above mentioned, then his or her share shall be equally
divided among the surviving children. And I do request and
enjoin upon my Executors named in my Will aforesaid, that they
do with their best discretion employ the labour of the said negroes
during the minority of the said children of the said Josias Heywards

and apply the profit of the same to the benefit and advantage of the said Charlotte, Daniel, Thomas and Joanna Heyward. And do hereby constitute and appoint my Executors named in the last Will and Testament above mentioned to be Executors of this Codicil.
