State, which I now possess in this Country, or
abroad. I further declare, having contracted a
partnership with M^r. J. B. Villeneuve of
Charleston which do not expire until May
next and never did draw any fund from
the said co-partnership, but I rely on his
probity, well known to render a true and
faithful account of the same to my said Wife
and also of an invoice of merchandises latterly
made to him for about two thousand odd ^{hundred} dol-
lars. So are my last Will. And to execute my pre-
sent Testament I nominate my said Wife Mar-
ianne Terrason jointly with M^r. J. B. Delaire
of Charleston Merchant or one in absence of the
