the City of Charleston in the State aforesaid do
make this my Last Will and Testament, and in the first
place it is my express direction that all my funeral ex-
pences and all my other just debts Shall be fully paid and
discharged. Item I give the sum of Five hundred Dollars to
John Deye the son of my friend Benjamin Deye. Item I give
devise and bequeath unto my Wife all my personal Estate and
real Estate and all every thing which I now own to her for
and during her natural Life and after her death I give de-
vise & bequeath all the personal and real estate which I
die Seized and possessed of to Mary Lockart the Daughter
of my wife Eliza Lockart to her and her heirs forever and
I do appoint and constitute Dr. Thomas G Fricoleau Executor
of this my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I
have hereunto set my seal and made my mark in presence of
the Subscribing witnesses at Charleston the fourteenth
day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight
hundred and twenty Seven and in the fifty Second of the
Sovereignty & Independence of the United States of America.
