JOHN P CHAZAL

17 R.^a In the Name of the Holy Trinity and in presence
N^o 48 of S. Hill, master, N Lindburg second master
Alexander Satour and John Vidal, passengers I John Peter
Chazal, Captain of the Brig Catharine declare my Last Wish-
es to wit, I name for my executors John Louis Pezant and
Peter Bernard Boutan inhabitants of Charleston South Ca-
rolina conjointly with Elizabeth Caroline Ann Chazal my
wife according to the power or authority which she has in
her hands, and to do their best to regulate my affairs
with advantage, expecially with the House of Sompeyrae &
Petitpain, who have not remitted to me their account Cur-
rent before my departure from Charleston for Marseilles
and which I have remitted myself to Mr J cardin to forward
to my Wife, My concerns which I have with this firm are
the only businefs that I have to settle and my Executors
must pay the greatest attention thereto On the arrival
of the Catherine at Charleston and the Cargo discharged
that the said Brig may be sold together and the Cargo at
public auction, neverthelefs if John L Pezant thinks to
make a better market in putting the said Cargo in Store
I authorize him to do so. Mr Petitpain by the letters that
he has written to Mr P Seras, Merchant at Marseilles,
thought to interest him in one third of the Cargo, not be-
ing willing to join in that affair I will Write to Mr P
Seras to buy the half of the Cargo for my account deduct-
ing all the expences and Costs incurred at Marseilles the
insurance not included, then if the offers which Mr Petit-
pain makes him are agreeable he can join him in the re-
mainder. The next businefs to arrange will not give much
trouble which is to divide in three parts the House Situ-
ated in Monirity Street, sold to Mr Kirkwood which will
not be due until November 1827, furthermore the two houses

adjoining which are not yet sold, either my Executors or
 Mr Previns who has it for sale, expect to sell next winter.
 The next thing to see to is an invoice of sugar & indigo
 that I carried to Charleston and which was sold in the
 said part by Philibert Perpin there remains a balance due
 to Mr Henry Alonzo the owner when he shall demand an ac-
 count. If the three last slaves which I bought from Mr
 Chazet do not pay their wages regularly it would be better
 to sell them, perhaps as much money may be got as was giv-
 en for them, as if my wife wishes to sell one of the three
 others I authorize her to do so. Done in duplicate on
 board the brig Catherine the sixteenth day of September
 one thousand eight hundred & twenty six
