money as may be collected of the book debts, and after the
discharge of all the just debts against me I order that as much
monies as may be wanted to purchase the freedom of Harriet
Cox from the Att^{rs}. of Slips but: Cox shall be immediately
put in practice and her freedom. I do immediately hereby
agree to that she and her Issue his free to all intents
and purposes whatsoever and likewise I give her the
two lots of land I bought in the Town of Purisbory on
Savannah River and that in order the more good she
may receive from them that my lawful receive for them
shall be immediately paid to her, or either of her Att^{rs}.
ney as she may may direct and all my my Estate what
shall remain be all for the use of Son Robert A'ron
Roberts and if he should be now no more in this world
then all my property as I intended and meant to be-
queath by this writing, should be equally divided amongst
my brother and sister's Children. In witness whereunto I
have hereto set my hand and seal, February 18th 1801.

This is my Will written

with my own hand which I make sound in mind, tho' sick in body, to guard against events which might prevent me from making it with as much knowledge, judgment and reflection as I am now capable of doing. I declare that all the effects, furniture and slaves which now are in the house I occupy, excepting my wearing apparel, a golden box, which is the only jewel I have saved from the fire at Savannah, and the negro slaves Victor and Safflor, belong to and are the property of the free negro woman named Melanie, otherwise called Tumie. I declare that I was appointed Executor of the Estate of the late Andrew Lemaitre who died in Savannah in the State of Georgia, my Executors will find among my papers my account with the said Estate and the vouchers relative to the Administration of the same. I further declare that I have pecuniary concerns with the M^r. J. S. Skimely Merchant of this City, which concerns will be settled by my Executors, and in order to give the said Skimely a mark of my esteem and confidence, it is my will and intention that he shall have the use of the balance which may be found due to my Estate during nine months from and after my decease, without interest. I name and constitute as my heir and universal legatee, of all my property generally whatsoever, wheresoever it may be, to whatever sum it may amount and of whatever nature it may be, my only Son Jean Francois Boutinot Desrivaux, born of my marriage with the M^{rs}. Theadore Prompte my Wife which said Son probably now is in the Island of St. Domingo. I also nominate him Executor of such parts only of my Estate as are in the aforesaid Island of St. Domingo or in France, and I will and intend that in his joint capacity of heir and Executor, he shall take and possess the same on the day of my decease.
