my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking
and annulling all others formerly executed, In Wit-

and personal, bond debts, moneys &c. therefore
I give and bequeath unto my beloved Sister Flo-

all my part or proportion of the said bond debts
and moneys that I may be intitled unto, to be
equally divided between them share and share
alike, to be paid unto them as soon as possible
to each of their own use, and to dispose of as
they may think proper. Item I give and be-
queath unto my said Sister Floride Pyre,
my horse Polock, and my riding Chaise
which I request may be put in good repair
for her. Item I give and bequeath unto my
Niece Floride Taylor a small negro boy and a
small negro girl to be taken out of my part or
proportion of the Negroes as soon as they are
divided, and known which I have a right to, she
to be allowed to make choiice of them, to her
and the heirs of her body. Item I give the two
matches I have, one to my niece Floride Taylor,
the other to my Nephew Thomas Ashby, the choice
as they may agree between them, all the residue
