Kingdom of Great Britain but now of Charleston
in the State aforesaid being in perfect health of
body and of sound mind and memory and
understanding praised be God for the same
do make this my last Will and Testament in
manner following. First I will and desire that

My body may be decently buried in such a
manner as is customary in the place where I may
die, regard being had to the forms and ceremonies
of the Christian religion under the full belief
of which I have lived and in the faith where
of hope to die. And after all my just debts are
fully paid and discharged as well as the expense
of my funeral, my worldly Estate with which
it has pleased God to bless me I dispose of the
same in manner following. In token of the
esteem and regard in which I have and bear
towards M^{rs} Connor Fry late of Gray's Inn
Lane Holborn London, but now or late of
South Street Finsbury Moorefields also in the
Kingdom of Great Britain I give and bequeath
unto her the sum of five guineas to buy a
mourning ring to be worn by her after my
decease in remembrance of me. All the rest
and residue of my Estate of whatsoever na-
ture it may consist either in money, secu-
rities for money stock in trade, goods, chat-
tels Estate and effects of what nature soever
I give and bequeath in manner following two
thirds of the whole amount thereof to my be-
loved Mother Mary Filley late resident in
the Parish of Saint John the Baptist Peter-
borough Northampton Shire likewise in the
Kingdom of Great Britain to her, her Executors
Administrators and assigns. The remaining
one third I give and bequeath to my beloved
Sister Mary Filley of the same place last
described to her, her Executors, Administra-
tors and assigns, in case both my said Mo-
ther and Sister be living at my death,
but if either of them shall happen to die be-
fore me I give and bequeath the share of her
so dying to the survivor of them, but in case
both of them should die before me, then and

in that case I give and bequeath their respective shares of my Estate to Miss Hannah Westcott late of Gray's Inn Lane Holborn London but now or lately of South Street Finsbury Moorefields in Great Britain as aforesaid to her her Executors Administrators and Assigns. And I do hereby nominate and constitute my Mother the said Mary Tilly Executrix and Samuel Rodgers and Charles Banks both of Charleston Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
