Should I die in the Foreign Land it is my wish that

my body may be brought to the United States and deposited
in the Church yard of my native place at Newton
N.J. provided my friends find it can be done without much
difficulty or trouble. If it cannot be done, If it cannot be
done easily I am willing they should do with it as they
think best. All the expenses to be defrayed out of what
property I may leave. And as to the remainder of my
Estate which is hath pleased God to entrust me with
I dispose of the same as follows. I wish I direct that
all my real Estate of which I am possessed which is
two thirds of the Store No 5 Hayne St Charleston also
400 acres of Land in Prince County Illinois should
be sold by my Executors for it's value for current mo-
ney, or on such Credit and the amount thereof secured
in such manner as is usual in such cases to secure the
full and punctual payment. My Executors to dispose
of it at such time as in their judgment it can be done
to the best advantage. I also direct that the net produce
of my personal Estate, which is comprised in notes
due me by Geo H Kelsey amounting to about Eight
Thousand dollars shall be divided as follows One
Thousand dollars each to my brothers James M
Halsted Wm M Halsted Chas M Halsted Jacob
Halsted and M V Halsted, one Thousand dollars

Halsted and M V Halsted, one thousand dollars
to my sister Anna. Two thousand dollars to my sister
Mary. Also I direct that the rent of my real Estate
if not sold or the interest on the produce of my real
Estate if sold should be paid two thirds to my
Father for his own use and purposes during his
life time and the remaining one third shall be paid
to my Aunts Mary Mc Intire & Jane Mc Intire
And at the death of my Father it shall be divided
as follows. Five hundred dollars each to my
two Aunts before named and the remainder shall
be divided among my brothers & sisters in the same
proportion as the amount bears to their several lega-
cies before named. And I do hereby make and
ordain my two brothers James M Halsted and William
M Halsted for my Executors of this my last will
and Testament In witness whereof I Job Halsted
of the Testator have to this my last will written on
one sheet of paper set my hand & Seal this fifteenth
day of Dec^r in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
