17 R.^s State of South Carolina. In the Name of God
N^o 44 Amen. I Louis Boudo of the City of Charles-
ton and State aforesaid being in good health and of sound
& disposing mind memory and understanding blefssed be God
for the same ~~fer-the-same~~ but considering the uncertainty
of this Life and that it is allotted to all Men to die
and being desirous of disposing of such Estate and Effects
as it hath pleased God to blefs me with whilst I have
Strength and Capacity so to do revoking all Wills and
testaments by me at any time heretofore made do make and
publish this my Last Will and testament in manner and form
following that is to say. In the first place I commit my
soul into the hands of my Creator and my Body to its par-
ent earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discre-
tion of my executors hereinafter named, and as to my world-
ly Estate & Effects, I give devise and bequeath dispose of
the same in the manner following to wit. I give devise
and bequeath to my beloved Wife Heloise S Boudo one third
part or portion of all the real and personal Estate of
which I may die seized or pofsefsed of, to her and her
heirs and afsigns forever and the other remaining two
thirds I give devise and bequeath the same to be equally
divided share and share alike as tenants in common among
such children as I may leave at the time of my death, but
should my Wife be ensient or pregnant at that time such
child or children as may be the ifsue of such pregnancy
is and are to have an equal share or shares with my oth-
er children all of whom are to have a fee simple in the
property hereby bequeathed and devised. But should my
wife marry after my decease my Will and desire is that
the Estate and Effects of my children should not be under
the Control of any future husband, but in that case some

one of my friends whom the Court of Equity may deem a fit
 and proper person should be appointed the guardian
 of my said children and I hereby I do hereby nominate Gar-
 retts and appoint Charles Williamson and Francis De-
 quette Executors of this my last Will a testament in
 witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
 my seal this first day of August in the year of our Lord
 one thousand eight hundred and twenty five and in the
 seventh year of American Independence.
