Box 36 in and by the marriage Settlement made between Captain
N^o 12 William Booth of the one part myself Margaret Booth his
wife (then Margaret Gardner) of the second part and Archi-
bald Whitney of the third part bearing date the Seventh
day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and thirty five and duly recorded the ninth day
of the same month and upon the Estate of the said Margaret
Gardner was settled to the several uses and purposes set forth
in the said deed, and the said deed among many other Clau-
ses contained the following To Wit. And Lastly I the said
William Booth doth give the right to the said Margaret
Gardner to make a will in or by which she may dispose
after my decease. Now I Margaret Booth in pursuance
of the said power of disposition above recited being of sound
mind memory and understanding thanks be to God for
the same do make and add in this to be my last will &
Testament by me made. After the death of my husband
Captain William Booth I give devise and bequeath to my
Grand daughter Margaret Gardner, now Margaret Watson
my house Nos N^o 12 Magazine Street also my house &
Lot number 11 Pico's alley both in the City of Charleston
Provided in case the said Margaret should die without
leaving lawful issue living at her death the said

Grand daughter Margaret Gardner now Margaret Watson
my house Nos N^o 12 Magazine Street also my house &
lot number 11 Price's alley both in the City of Charleston
But in case the said Margaret should die without
leaving lawful issue living at her death then I give devise
and bequeath the same to my Grandson Henry B Gardner

and in case he should die without leaving lawful issue
living at his death then to my Brother Archibald Whitney
his Children for their joint use, not to be subject to the debts
or liabilities of the said Archibald. Also I give devise &
bequeath to my Grand Son Henry W. Gardner my house
and lot number 8 in Burn's Lane also my house &
lot number 23 in George Street both in the City of Charleston
with the same limitations over to my Grand daughter
and my Brother and his Children as are above mentioned
in case the said Henry & Margaret should die without
leaving lawful issue living at his or her death. Also I give
and bequeath to my Brother Archibald Whitney and his
Children for their joint use only not to be any way liable
for the debts or liabilities of the said Archibald my Slaves
Pannah Paddy Linda Billy Dick and Fortune and the
future issue and increase of the females. Also I give
and bequeath to my niece Margaret Gardner Whitney
my Slave Jenny Pannah's daughter absolutely. Also
I give and bequeath to my Grand daughter the said
Margaret Gardner now Margaret Watson my gold watch
all my silver and the privilege of taking such part of my
furniture she may wish. The rest of my furniture to be
sold by my Executor to pay my debts and should the
same not be sufficient to pay my debts then the

same not be sufficient I desire my husband to pay the
difference out of his income. But if my husband should
not be living then to be paid out of the income of the property
which I have bequeathed to my brother and his children.
Also I give to my Aunt Elizabeth Bradley an annuity
one hundred dollars payable quarterly during her life
and I desire my husband to pay the same out of his income
and after his death I direct it to be paid out of the income
of the bequest to my brother and his children. Also I give my
Wearing apparel to be divided among my Aunt Elizabeth
Bradley, my Cousin Catherine Harvey and my daughter
in Law Mary E. Chevering. Also I give to the Baptist
Church in Church Street Charleston one hundred dollars
To the Furrman Institute in Fairfield one hundred dollars
To the Baptist Female Missionary Society in Charleston
fifty dollars. To the Baptist Mission in Sumner fifty
dollars and I direct the last four legacies to be paid out
of the income of the property devised to my Grandchildren.
Lastly I appoint my brother Archibald Whitney &
Peter Chevering of the High Hills of Santee Executors
of this my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal at Charleston this
Eighth day of November one thousand Eight hundred
and forty five
