and memory, altho' indisposed in body: Do make this my last
Will and Testament, I commit my soul to the mercy of the All-
mighty, in full confidence of future Salvation, through our blessed
redemptor Jesus Christ. My body to the ground, from whence it
came, and my worldly goods both real and personal I dispose of
in the following manner. I give and bequeath unto Samuel J.
Waggoner my house and lot, situate on the West side of Church Street
^{near the old Church} known by the number 65/ sixty five, formerly the property of the late
Mrs. Smythers, deceased, also my negro woman named Linda, my
negro boy named Jacob, and all my furniture, to him his heirs,
executors administrators & assigns. In trust to and for the several uses,
intents and purposes herein after mentioned and by me declared.
In trust and to and for the joint use and benefits of my mother
Elizabeth Buckle and my Daughters Mary Brammer and Elizabeth
Charles for and during the natural life of my said mother Eliz.
Buckle and after her decease, then in trust and to and for the use
benefit and behoof my said daughters Mary Brammer and Eliza-
beth Charles, share and share alike, to them and their heirs for-
ever. But should either of my said daughters die before she attains the
age of twenty one year or before her marriage, then

in the following manner. I give and bequeath unto Samuel J. Waggoner my house and lot, situate on the West side of Church Street near the old Church known by the number /65/ sixty five, formerly the property of the late Mr. Smythers, deceased, also my negro woman named Linda, my negro boy named Jacob, and all my furniture, to him his heirs, executors administrators & assigns. In trust to and for the several uses, intents and purposes herein after mentioned and by me declared - In trust and to and for the joint use and benefit of my mother Elizabeth Buckle and my Daughters Mary Brammer and Elizabeth Charles for and during the natural life of my said mother Elizth Buckle and after her decease, then in trust and to and for the use benefit and behoof my said daughters Mary Brammer and Elizabeth Charles, share and share alike, to them and their heirs forever. But should either of my said daughters die before she attains the age of twenty one year or before her marriage, then and in that case In trust for the sole use benefit and behoof of the survivor of them to her and her heirs forever. And I do hereby nominate and appoint my friend Samuel J. Waggoner to be Executor and my mother Elizabeth Buckle to be ^{my} Executrix, to this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all and every other Will heretofore made by me. Made and done and sealed with my seal as my last Will and testament at Charleston the thirteenth

134. of November 1819.
