I do also give and bequeath to said Elisabeth my best mattress best feather bed and pair of pillows one bolster two pair of blankets three pair of sheets four pair of pillow cases one Suit of Calico for the bed my marseilla bed quilt and bed room carpet also my large brafs fire dogs shovel and tonge I do give and bequeath to my Daughter Susan W. Thayer one new bed quilt. I do give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary W. Newhall my largest family Bible. I do give and bequeath to my Daughter Margarte F Hartwell my set of China plated tea pot Milk cup. & Sugar dish. The balance of my part of my late husbands Estate I do give and bequeath and it is my will that it be equally divided between my three Daughters Susan W Thayer, Mary W. Newhall and Margaret F Hartwell to have & to hold forever, the cash that is left at my death I will and bequeath to the beferementioned Elisabeth Brodie to be by her guardians invested bank or other Stock and the interest thereof to be used for her Support until she is of lawful age and then to be disposed of as she thinks best. I will and bequeath to my son Robert Brodie my husbands Silver Watch, and I do hereby name and appoint my Son Robert Brodie and my son in law Edward Newhall to be my Executors of this my last Will and testament made and Signed this thirteenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred twenty five----- Mary Brodie (LS)
