I Mary Bockfield of Wapomdaw St. James' Goosecreek parish being low in body but of sound mind and memory do make this my last Will and testament in manner and form following: First I give and bequeath to my Son Benjamin my negro man Peter to him & his heirs for ever. Secondly I give and bequeath to my Son John Bockfield my negro wench Phillis with all the future issue to him and his heirs forever. Thirdly I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary M^cKeown my negro girl named Nanny with all her future increase and an old negro woman named Marshall forever to her and her lawful heirs. In the next place I will that all my stock of cattle one black mare and all the remaining part of my property be sold and the money equally divided between my aforesaid two Sons Benjamin Bockfield and John Bockfield and my daughter Mary M^cKeown. Lastly I will that the plantation that I now reside on shall be sold and the money^{to} be equally divided between my four children that is James Bockfield Benjamin Bockfield John Bockfield and Mary M^cKeown. And I hereby appoint and constitute Capt James Dehaq and my Son Benjamin Bockfield Executors to this my last Will and testament: in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal.
