twenty Shares in the United States Bank, to her her executors and admin-
istrators - I give and bequeath to my nephew George Bush Borge-
quin Blitherall Son of my said brother, my negro wench Pless Jenny
and her present and future issue and increase - to him his executors

unto my beloved husband the said James Thomas, the whole of my
property of whatever nature or kind and wheresoever the same may
be, both real and personal for and during the term of his natural
life and no longer. Item from and immediately after the death of
my said husband, I give, devise and bequeath the said property in man-
ner following, that is to say, I give and bequeath to my niece,
Eliza Inglis Blitherall daughter of my brother George C. Blitherall,
twenty Shares in the United States Bank, to her her executors and admini-
strators - I give and bequeath to my nephew George Bush Bap-
quin Blitherall Son of my said brother, my negro wench Slave Fanny
and her present and future issue and increase - to him his executors
and administrators. Item, I give devise and bequeath to my niece,
Maria Magdalena Blitherall daughter of my said brother and
her heirs executors and administrators my negro wench Slave named
Molly and his present and future issue and increase and also all
the rest and residue of my Estate both real and personal, whatever
or wheresoever the same is or may be. It is my devise and mean-
ing and I do hereby declare it to be my Will, that the property which
I have herein bequeathed and devised to my said two nieces, shall
not be delivered to them until they respectively attain the age of
Eighteen years or day of marriage; and that ^{which} I have bequeathed to my

W2. said nephew George should ^{not} be delivered to him until he
attains the age of twenty one Years. It is my further intention
and I do hereby declare it to be my Will, that my said niece
and nephew shall until the said respective periods when
I have directed the said property to be delivered to them, be entitled
to have and enjoy respectively the dividends, wages, profits and
rents of what is herein respectively bequeathed and devised to
each of them. Item, In case either of my said niece or my said
nephew shall depart this life before me, I give devise and be-
queath in that event, to the survivors or survivor of them then
her or his heirs, executors and administrators, the property
I have herein bequeathed to them him or her so dying respec-
tively: and in case of the death of all my above named Nieces
and Nephews before me, then I give devise and bequeath the
whole of my Estate ^{both} real and personal after the death of my
said Husband, to my dear Brother, George B. Clitherall of pre-
