MARY MAGDALEN CANNELLE de NORROY

17 R.^d In the Name of the Holy Trinity, Father Son &
 18 Holy Spirit I Mary Magdalen Cannelle Widow Nor-
 roy Lawful issue of the Late Mr William Cannelle and of
 his late Wife Mary Anne Cannelle, born Dumes, inhabitants
 at Verettes Island of St. Domingo, Settled in this City
 aged of about fifty years, widow from my first marriage
 of Mr James Le Pot Du Carroy, from my Second marriage of
 Mr Louis Pettou and from my third marriage of Mr John
 Francois de Norroy, being indisposed in body but of sound
 mind memory judgment and understanding but liable to be
 surprised by death, the time of which is always uncertain,
 have made and dictated my present testament thus and in
 the manner which follows. 1st I recommend my Soul to God
 beseeching his Divine Majesty to grant it mercy; My inten-
 tion is that my body be interred in the Roman Catholic
 Church in Hazell Street having been brought up in the doc-
 trines which she teaches and hoping by the Grace of the
 Sovereign Lord of the Universe to die in the same faith.
 3. I wish that my debts be paid and my wrongs redressed
 should any be found at my death. 4th I give and bequeath
 to the Church saint Finbar to contribute to the purchase
 of a Cemetery one hundred Dollars to be taken from the
 first funds which may be received from the indemnity
 granted by the French Government for my property which I
 have at St. Domingo. 5th I give and bequeath to Josephine
 a free mulattoe aged about ten years two hundred Dollars
 to be taken also from the funds coming from the said in-
 demnity which said two hundred Dollars shall be placed
 out for her advantage but not to receive the Capital till
 she is twenty one years of age. 6th I name and constitute
 as my Executor Testamentary & Legatory general Mr Peter
 Bernard Boutan disposing myself in his favour at the

hour of my death of all my goods and rights whether Situated at Charleston or St Domingo or elsewhere for my said universal Legates to enjoy or dispose of in the same manner as if my goods were always his property and in acknowledgment of the signal services which he done me by the particular care he has taken of me during my sickness, whether in advances or otherwise, that I have received from the said Gentleman since I have been in Charleston. I desire all those who have had any interest or affection for me to receive my Last adieux and to pardon the little wrongs which I may have committed towards them, declaring that by the present I forget all those of whom I have cause to complain and pardon them, done and Signed at Charleston South Carolina this 3^d February 1826, and 50 year of the Independence of the United States of America.
