No 3 aforesaid being weak in body but thankful that I have
a sound and disposing mind do make this my last
will and Testament in form following. I give and
devise my undivided share or part of the house & lot
in Broad Street where the family resides to my three
sisters Jane Elizabeth and Ann Wenthrop to them
equally during their joint lives. And from and after
the death of either of them to the survivors successively
and to the longest liver of them absolutely. Item I give
and bequeath to my servant maid Clara and her present
and future issue to my sisters Jane and Elizabeth &
recommends her to their particular care on account of
her long and faithful services to me. Item I direct my
Ten shares in the Bank of Charleston to be sold and
after payment of all debts or expences, and the amount
to be equally divided. One half to my brother Henry
Wenthrop as a mark of my remembrance of his long
professional attentions to me, the other half to be equally
divided between my four brothers Joseph Frederick
William and John Wenthrop. Of my twelve shares in
the Bank of South Carolina I give six to be equally
divided between my three said sisters. The other six

the Bank of South Carolina I give six to be equally
divided between my three said sisters. The other six
I direct to be sold and out of the proceeds thereof I give
to my beloved Cousin Mrs Sophia Warley Fifty dollars
to my friend Miss Harriett McCall Thirty dollars
and the same to Mrs Kay. Whatever surplus there be I
would prefer it's being applied to the payment of expenses
rather than than the provision above made for that purpose
so as to relieve the same. I direct my executors hereinafter
named to apply the three shares I have in the Planter's
Mechanic's Bank to the use of my said servant Isaac
I appoint my brothers Frederick Winthrop and
Henry Winthrop Executors of this my last Will. In
witness whereof I have hereto set my hand and seal this
seventeenth day of August in the year of our Lord Eight
teen hundred & forty six
