their attorney hereunto I set my hands and Seal revoke all former Wills  
the third day of August 1821 and in the forty fifth year of American

As I am now far advanced in age and failing rapidly  
and perhaps very soon make be taken away like believe (looking in the

thank you for all your dutiful affection always shown to me particularly when  
living in your house and I hope God will help you and your Family to

of settling my little matters. In the first place Mr. Wishart may be allowed  
to choose an owner and the money arising from the sale of her to be equally

and Daughter their Parents part, and to my Sons Archibald P. B. Lord and  
Robert B. Lord after paying Robert B. Lord two Shaws which are his  
property tho in my name, also the dividends of two Shaws & since the year  
1809 there are Sixteen Shaws in the South Carolina Bank in my name  
which are to be disposed off as mentioned above, there are also in the same  
Bank eight Shaws belonging to Estate of my dear Husband which must  
be divided in three Equal parts between my two Sons and the children  
of my Son Richard Lord Mr John Howell having received his full  
proportion of what was due to my daughter as Elizary Lord. Except  
her part of a small tract of Land on Syren's Creek not yet sold and which  
Mr. Jack Adams has the papers off. the few books I have I give to my  
Grand daughter Mrs. Campbell Except my Family Bible which I  
give to my Son R. B. Lord with my dying request that he will frequently  
read it my beding and what little furniture I have thinking this little  
it may be of some use I give to my Son A. B. Lord and it is my dying  
request my dear Son that you endeavour to instill Religious principles  
in your dear children while they are young. I think them well disposed
