My Dear Son

August 8th 1844

As I am now far advanced in age and feel very frail
and perhaps very soon make be taken away and believe (trusting in the
merits of my services) that my sins the great debt many will be forgiven by a
Mansfield God And an End to all my afflictions. I leave my Dear Son
thank you for all your dutyfull affection always shown to me particularly when
living in your house and I hope God will bless you and your family &c.

increase your happiness. And that your prospects though at present I am
 grieved to say are I think but gloomy may brighten and that you will
 use your best exertions for your children. I beg you will take the trouble
 of settling my little matters. In the first place I wish that may be allowed
 to chase an owner and the money arising from the sale of her to be equally
 with what little else I have be divided to the children of my deceased Son
 and Daughter their Parents part, and to my sons Archibald, R. B. Lord and
 Robert. B. Lord after paying Robert. B. Lord two Shares which are his
 property tho in my name, also the dividends of two Shares & since the year
 1809 there are Sixteen Shares in the South Carolina Bank in my name
 which are to be disposed off as mentioned above. there are also in the same
 Bank eight Shares belonging to Estate of my dear Husband which must
 be divided in three Equal parts between my two Sons and the children
 of my Son Richard Lord Mr John Howell having received his full
 proportion of what was due to my daughter as Mary Lord. Except
 her part of a small tract of Land on Lynch's creek not yet sold and which
 Mr Joel Adams has the papers off. the few books I have I give to my
 Grand daughter Mrs M. Campbell Except my Family Bible which I
 give to my Son R. B. Lord with my dying request that he will frequently
 read it my beding and What little furniture I have thinking tho little
 it may be of some use I give to my Son R. B. Lord and it is my dying
 request my dear Son that you endeavour to instill Religious principles
 in your dear children while they are young. I think them well disposed

January 8th 1822. I forgot to mention I am indebted to my Sister Huger on account of the Free Negroes that was my Sister Sobcock. it must be paid, there will be very little to share indeed I wish it was more for your Sakes —
