J. Sergeant by his present wife Mary Ann Sergeant, and when
said Children shall all arrive to the age of Twenty one years, then to
cause the aforesaid Property to be equally divided among such of the
Children as shall ^{at that time} ~~be~~ ^{live} and the Children of such as may
dead (the ^{child} or children to take the share among them to which they
would have been entitled) and in case the Children of my brother by his
present wife Mary Ann. should die before they attain the age of Twenty
one and without leaving lawful issue living at the time of their death
then I give and bequeath the said property so bequeathed to my beloved
Sister Ann Eliza Lesesne. Item I give and bequeath whatever sum
money may be entitled to under the Will of my grandmother M.
Ann Sergeant late of Stamford in England unto my brother in law
Charles Lesesne his ~~Executors~~ and administrators upon the trust and to the
uses interest and purposes following, that is to say, In trust for the child
of my Sister Ann Eliza Lesesne, to be kept until she shall attain the age of

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then I give and bequeath the said property so bequeathed to my beloved
Sister Ann Eliza Lescome. Item I give and bequeath whatever sum
money may be entitled to under the Will of my grandmother Mr.
Ann Sargeant late of Stamford in England unto my brother in law
Charles Lescome his ~~Executors~~ and administrators upon the trust and to
uses interest and purposes following, that is to say, In trust for the child
of my Sister Ann Eliza Lescome, by her present Husband Charles Lescome
and as the children arrive at the age of Twenty or marry, then can
the ^{of the} said property to be equally divided among such of the children
may then be living, hereby appointing their Father Charles Lescome
the guardian of the same during their minority. Item I give
and bequeath to my friend Mary Lathrop the sum of Three
thousand dollars out of the money I may be entitled to under the
Will of my grandmother. I do hereby ^{constitute of} appoint my said brother in
law Charles Lescome and my friends James Addison Executors also
Sister Ann Eliza Lescome Executrix of this my last Will. Witness
