I do hereby authorize and empower my ^{& Executor} Executrix herein
after named to sell and dispose of all or any part of my
Estate real or personal & to invest the proceeds in any other
property real or personal which they may deem most

the advantage of my wife and Children. Lastly I nominate
and appoint my said wife Martha Sarah Stobo and my
