 appoint my worthy friends Gabriel Gignilliat Francis c Marion
 and Elias Couturier Executors of this my last Will and Testa-
 ment and I do hereby disannul all others Wills by me heretofore
 made and this to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness

 scribing Witnesses on this ninth day of April one thousand
 eight hundred. It is my desire that the money at interest be
 where it is until c M^{rs} Robert Burdells Children is of age.
