And in case of the death of both my daughter Sarah Elizabeth and the child with which my Wife is now pregnant (or the latter not being born alive) before the age of twenty one years and without Issue of their bodies living at their decease, then the shares of the said Children to go, be and remain to my said Wife Jane Phipps, to hold to her, her heirs, executors, administrators and assigns for ever. And lastly I hereby nominate constitute and appoint the Reverend Thomas Frost, of the City and State aforesaid Executor and my Wife Jane Phipps Executrix of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former and other Wills by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this first day of January in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two and in the twenty sixth Year of American Independence.

12th Brumaire the 10th Year, The Testament of Peter Blondel. Before me underwritten Simon Jude Chancogney, agent of the general commissariat of the french republic to the United States of America, invested with the direction of the commissariat of Charleston State of South Carolina, in presence of the Witnesses hereunder named and underwritten, my present Citizen Pierre Blondel, born at Saussignac, department of the Dordogne, aged about forty nine years, formerly practising the law in the Island of Guadeloupe, and now living accidentally in the City of Charleston, found in an upper room of the house which he occupies, corner of Meeting and Society Streets, lying on his bed, sick in his body, but sound of mind, memory, judgment and understanding, as has appeared to me the above said Agent and the underwritten Witnesses, who have requested of me to receive his last dispositions and in consequence thereof has dictated to me word for word his present Will and Testament as follows. I give and bequeath to the Citizen's Marie Barbe Arsonneau, Wife of the Citizen Edme Champy, living in this Town all and generally what I possess in the United States, and which will be found after my decease, the whole

her property, and she to enjoy it as such as soon as I have departed this life. With respect to any other property which I may own in France this I give and bequeath unto my lawful heirs the same to be shared by equal proportion between them. Stand for the execution of my present Testament concerning the legacy bequeathed unto the Citizen Wife Champy, I do name and appoint the person of the Citizen Jacques Delaire, merchant of this City of Charleston, whom I request to take this trouble jointly with Marie Barbe Aronneau Wife of Edme Champy. Thus has been done, dictated and named word for word, by the said Citizen Pierre Blondel the Testator, to me the undersigned Agent in presence of the said Witnesses, and by me read and read over again to the said Pierre Blondel the Testator, in presence of the same Witnesses, which said present Testament, the said Citizen Pierre Blondel has declared to understand and comprehend well, and that such are his last intentions in which he persists, declares moreover the said Testator to revoke any other Will and Testament which he might have made before, wishing that this present have its full and entire effect as containing his last Will and disposition. Done and written in the room above described, the tenth Year of the French Republic one and indivisible, and the twelfth day of Brumaire at half past ten o'clock in the forenoon, in presence of the Citizens Francois Laborde and Pierre Parreyre, both Frenchmen and residing in this said City of Charleston, required Witnesses who with the said Testator and me the above said Agent, have signed the present

In the Name of God Amen, I Francis Jones of St James Parish, Berkly County State of South Carolina being weak in body, but of sound mind and memory, do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament, first of all I give and recommend my soul to God through the blood of my dear redeemer, as to my worldly Estate with which God hath blessed me, I give and dispose of in the following manner, I leave the use of all my Negroes

my Wife Mary Jones during her life, and immediately after her death to be equally divided between all my Children to share and share alike to them and the lawful Issue of their bodies, and for want of Children of either of them at the time of their decease, then to revert to those of my surviving Children at that period, and the heirs of their bodies for ever. Item I leave to my Wife Mary Jones the use of my stock of Cattle, and the privilege of making use of such of my said stock as she may stand in need of, for her sustenance, together with the use of my house and household furniture, also my horses and hogs, and to have the use of all of the aforesaid during her life, and after her decease to be equally divided among all my Children, to them and their heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath to my Wife Mary all the monies I have at present in hand. Item I will that all monies due me by bonds, notes or book accounts to be equally divided between my Wife and all my Children, to them and their heirs for ever. Item my will and desire is that if Mrs Susanna Lewis Newham should continue boarding with my Wife Mary Jones after my decease, that the sum of money allowed by the commissioners of the poor of Saint James Parish annually for her board, that the same shall be appropriated to the use and benefit of my Wife Mary and all my Children, and each of them to have an equal share, whenever collected by my Executors. Last of all I do hereby nominate and appoint as my sole Executrix and Executors to this my last Will and Testament the following persons, namely my Wife Mary Jones, Mr Archibald McEllen and my Son Thomas Jones. In Witness whereof I have hereunto interchangeably set my hand and seal the twenty fourth day of April, and in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred.
