a Law Suit which I abhor. I leave unto the before mentioned Margaret my Negro
boy named Samboe during her life time, it is then my Wish to have him im-
mancipated he being a faithful servant. I leave Ann M. Bride and her
issue my right in the Blebe Lot in Georges Street and the remainder of pro-
perty to be divided between my Brother James Kennedy and my Sister Molly
Shaw and Phoebe alike when She When She get married or comes of age
it is my Wish that Maria and her daughter Phoebe get their freedom Phoebe
to remain with Ann M. Bride until she is eighteen years of age. I leave
Edward Welch my Secretary and Book Case and Books. I leave M.
Kennedy the use of the Store and back room free of rent for three years
and the Stock to be Valued and given to him free of Interest for
twelve months. I likewise leave him five hundred Doll^r for Services
& I leave it to my Executors hereafter mentioned to dispose of

and the Stock to be Valued and given to him for
twelve months I likewise leave him five hundred Doll^r for Services
rendered I leave it to my Executors hereafter mentioned to dispose of
my personal property at any time they may think proper and my
House and Lot at the expiration of four years I leave my Brother
James Fifty pounds Sterling. Lastly I appoint Simon Magwood
and James Edgar and Thedy Kilkenney my Executors Michael King
their attorney hereunto I set my hands and Seal revoke all former Wills
the third day of August 1821 and in the forty sixth year of American
Independence — Peter Kennedy 29
