children with their future Issue and Isaac, also my carriage and
Horse to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to
my Executors ^{hereafter} hereafter named all the rest and residue of my
real and personal property to them, and their heirs, in Trust,
for the uses and purposes hereinafter mentioned and declared.
First, it is my Will, that as soon after my death as may be
thought requisite and proper for making a division of my Estate
all my property both real and personal shall be sold in such
manner and on such terms and conditions as by my Executors and
Executors ^{aforesaid} may be thought fit and proper for the advantage of my Estate
and that they shall divide and dispose of the Proceeds of such Sale or
Sales in manner and proportions following following, that is to say,
To my daughter Ann Violetta Wyatt, one third part to be paid to
her at her own disposal in such shape and manner as she may
require. To my daughter Susanna Donovan, the wife of George
John George Mayr, one third part, to be held by her in trust, separate

my Executors, ^{hereafter} named all the rest and residue of my
real and personal property to them, and their heirs, in Trust,
for the uses and purposes hereinafter mentioned and declared.
First, it is my Will, that as soon after my death as may be
thought requisite and proper for making a division of my Estate

Elizabeth, the wife of Doctor James Brickell Hill, the remaining one
third to be paid to her, ^{to be} at her own disposal in any manner she may
think proper. Lastly I appoint William Lucas, John Duffin, and
my daughter Ann Violitta Wyatt Executors and Administrators of my
