House of mine for the care they took of me. I owe to wash and bullock
about ten dollars. I grant badollar to Marguill in the house I reside

in his House and kindness to me; I owe to my Baker three dollars. I
owe to a candle maker in King street, close who used to keep my Maps
about five dollars. The remainder of my property I leave to the Princeton
Ladies, in order to defray the expenses of my funeral. Mr. Leat again

now live on, as at present divided off and enclosed by me, con-
taining thirty feet front on Beaufain Street, and in depth ^{feet}
together with the buildings and improvements thereon standing, to
