one third part of my Estate real and personal that is to say a third of my Estate
real and personal as will amount to one third part of all the property that I
am possessed of either in my own or in her right and so that she with my
two Daughters shall take an Equal portion I have and I have like. I do give
and bequeath to her all my household furniture of whatever kind my carriages
boats and horses &c. I bequeath to her to her heirs and assigns forever my house
Negroes Molly, Betty, Susy, Kelly, Adam, Henry and Sud I give & devise to
her all my house or tenement situate and lying in Montague Street in
the City of Charleston with all the furniture, all that Lot of Land with
and Outhouses and appurtenances and all my right title and interest therein.
To my Daughter Sus and Whisler to her and to her issue forever I give
and bequeath the other third part of my Estate and as part thereof I
give and bequeath to her the following Negroes Mintie and her five chil-
dren viz. Caroline, Billy, Coffey, Alfred, Charles. Also my Carpenter
Abraham his Wife Lydia and their child Minnie with the Mulatto
girls Sarah. To my Daughter Julia Whisler to her and to her issue
forever I give the remaining third part of my ^{Estate} and as part thereof the fol-
lowing Negroes the eight Children of Peg viz. Charlotte, Manemia, Peter,
Dick, Betsey, Fanny, Laura and Georgiana together with their Mother
Peg who shall be during the life my Wife May Whisler subject to her
Control and direction at her death to my Daughter Julia to her and to
her issue forever. Also I give and bequeath to her the two Negro Girls, Bella

leg who shall be during the life my wife Mary & my son Joseph as his
consent and direction at his death to my daughter Julia to her and to
her issue forever. Also I give and bequeath to her the two Negro Girls Bella
and Betsy to her and to her issue forever. Should either of my daughters
die without issue then and in that case I give the share of her so dying
to be Equally divided between the Survivors and her Mother should she
survive but should the Mother die first then to the Survivors of them
should either of them die without issue leaving a husband then and in
that case I will and ordain that ten thousand Dollars shall be paid in
five annual instalments to the husband of either of them so surviving. It
is my Will and desire that the legacies to my daughters of the above men-
tioned Negroes at the division of my Estate shall not be considered as
entitling either of them to more than an Equal share but that those Negroes
shall be considered on division as part of such share and further that no
division of my Estate shall be made but that it shall continue as hitherto
untill my Daughter arrive at the age of twenty one or marry which first
shall happen. Lastly I hereby constitute my Wife Mary Christian Ex-
