South Carolina. In the Name of God Amen. I Robert Long of the
City of Charleston, and State of South Carolina, being of sound and
disposing mind and memory - and aware of the uncertainty of life:
do make this my last Will and Testament in words following - that
is to say: My lawful debts and funeral expences are to be paid
by my Executor hereinafter named as soon after my decease and
may be possible, and as to my worldly Estate, the same I dispose of as
follows. I will devise and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Susan
Eliza Langton, the wife of my friend John Langton, to her and her
heirs forever, all that piece part or parcel of a Town lot of land situate lying
and being in Church Street between Saint Philips Church and the Centre
Market, in the City of Charleston aforesaid, heretofore known in the plan
of the said Town by the Number one hundred & fifty six (156) measuring
in front on the west side of Church Street aforesaid thirty seven feet more
or less and in depth Westwardly from Church Street aforesaid two
hundred and Seventy feet more or less, measuring on the West
end from South to North fifty one feet more or less, which said
lot is bounded on the South by a lot of land belonging ^{to} John
I. Schnell, on the North by a lot of land belonging to the Rev.
William Johnson, to the West on a lot of land belonging to El-
speth Davidson, now occupied by J. Loring Esq. a Gentleman
out of Meeting Street, and to the East on Church Street aforesaid one

110. is now knowne now by the number Seventy five /75/ and
in the occupation of Isadore Mervy (or Merte) of the City of
Charleston appears aforesaid Robert Langton. And I do hereby revo-
cate and appoint my said friend and Son in law John
Langton, to be my sole Executor: and I do hereby revoke all
former or other Wills made by me at any time heretofore
and publish and declare this as my last and only Will
dated at Charleston on this Twenty seventh day of January
in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and
Nineteen.
