In the Name of God Amen, I Sarah Treare of the City of Charleston in the State of South Carolina Widow being at present sick and weak in body but of sound mind memory and understanding praised be God for the same do make and declare this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. I give devise and bequeath unto my friend Frederick Rohne of Charleston Merchant all that my lot of land situate lying and being at the corner of Pitt and Wentworth Streets in Charleston aforesaid which was purchased from Edward Lightwood with the hereditaments and appurtenance thereunto belonging and to his heirs and assigns for ever, on the condition that he pays to my Estate the sum of one thousand pounds sterling money immediately or soon after my decease the buildings and improvements on the said lot having been erected and made at the ex-

19 pence of the said Frederick Hohne. Item I give and be-
queath unto my daughter in law Ann Freare Widow
of my beloved Son John Freare now residing in the
Island of Bermuda all my wearing apparel and
furniture of what nature or kind soever and to her
heirs and assigns for ever. Item I will and direct that
my two Negro Children named Mary and Diana
shall until they respectively attain the age of fourteen
years be placed under the care and direction of the
said Ann Freare and until they shall have attained
that age I give and bequeath to each of them the sum
of six pounds payable yearly for the purpose of pro-
curing them cloaths and defraying other necessary
expences and after the said two Children shall have
attained the age aforesaid it is my will and desire that
they should return to Charleston and be manumitted
and set free and it is my will that their expences to
and from Bermuda be borne and paid out of my
Estate. Item all the rest of my Negroes which I may
die possessed of at the time of my decease I do hereby
order and direct to be sold either for cash or on credit
as to my Executors shall appear most advantageous
to my Estate and the monies arising from such
sale together with the aforesaid sum of one thousand
pounds to be paid by the said Frederick Hohne to
be put out at interest or vested in some public or private
fund or otherwise as may be deemed most advantage-
ous and productive to my Estate which said monies I
do hereby charge with and make subject to the clear
yearly annuity of one hundred pounds sterling money
which I give and bequeath to the said Ann Freare
for and during the term of her natural life and from
and immediately after the decease of the said Ann
Freare then my will is and I do hereby give devise
and bequeath the said monies arising from the sales
of my Negroes and the said one thousand pounds to

100 be paid by the said Frederick Hohne in whatever manner the same may be then vested to the commissioners of the Orphan House for the time being in trust and upon the express condition that the interest arising therefrom be by them applyed for the benefit of the said institution (I mean the Orphan House in the City of Charleston). And I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my friends Frederick Hohne and David Alexander both of the City of Charleston Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void all former and other Wills by me at any time or times heretofore made declaring this only to be and contain my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I the said Sarah Freare have hereunto set my hand and seal this fifteenth day of May in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one.

Trever of Darlington District, in the State of South Carolina, being weak in body, but of sound and perfect mind and memory, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, that is to say, first I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Mary Ann C. Trever all my household furniture, and the following Negroes, namely Carolina, Betty, Amy, Phillis and Smart. I do also give and devise unto her my said Wife, the house in which I now live on Myrtle Hill, with the whole of my one half of the tract of land on which it stands, together with my share of the Mills thereto belonging, which I give her in lieu of all dower. Secondly, I give and bequeath unto Ann Brown, the Mother of my Wife, a full suit of mourning. Thirdly, As to the rest, residue and remainder of my Estate real and personal I do hereby give devise and bequeath the same to my said Wife and my five beloved Children, viz Ann Eliza C. Trever, John Evander C. Trever, David Williams C. Trever, Thomas Edwards C. Trever and Alexander Markland C. Trever, to be equally divided among them, but it is to be understood as my will and desire, that my whole Estate is to be kept entire for the equal benefit of all my family (the profits of which to be disposed of at the discretion of my said Wife) until my
