 of death, do make this my last will and Testament
 I do commit my Soul into the hands of my Redeemer;
 hoping and trusting in his Righteousness alone for my
 Salvation, I wish my Body to be removed to Charleston
 to be interred with my dear Doctor Hollinshead
 Imprimis. I renounce, release, quit claim and confirm
 to the surviving Heirs of John McCalla, and to their Heirs
 & assigns forever, all the Interest & Estate which I may
 have, or can claim to a Tract of Land called "Hartford"
 containing about three hundred & one acres & three quarters,
 situate in the County of Northumberland in the State of
 Pennsylvania: And also to another Tract of Land called
 Mount Sorell, containing the same quantity of Land and
 situate in the same County & State last aforesaid. Item:
 I confirm unto my Nephews & Nieces, John, William, Daniel &
 Asa, and Rachel McCalla the conveyance & Title heretofore
 made to them of the Lots of Land & Buildings thereon, situate
 at the N.E. corner of Walnut & Second Streets in the City of Phila-
 delphia.

Seminary at Princeton, the Sum of One Thousand Dollars.
Item: I give the bequest unto the Lady's Society in Charleston South
Carolina, the sum of Two Hundred Dollars. Item: It being my
intention to emancipate my Carpenter Fellow "Tom"; and Cook Hann-
nah, and Pink Mary, and her child Hagar; and my Negro Man
John; I do hereby bequest the said Negroes Tom, Hannah, and Mary
unto my Executors hereinafter named, in Trust, that they or either of
them, do take the proper measures to complete the Emancipation
of the said three last mentioned Negroes, effectually in the Law,
immediately after my death; (even the other bequests therein abate
in consequence thereof;) and I do authorize either of my said
Executors to sign and execute the necessary deeds or other papers
of Manumission in their behalf; and I do hereby give the bequest
unto the said Tom, Hannah, and Mary, the Sum of Two Hundred
Dollars, each, to be vested immediately after my death, by my Executors
or either of them, in the Purchase of three several annuities for their
Lives respectively, in "The Pennsylvania Company for Insurance
on Lives & Granting Annuities" in Philadelphia, to be made
payable to Tom, Hannah & Mary severally by names

and I do hereby give bequeath the said black boy to said Miss Jane M. McCalla until the said child arrives at Twenty Eight Years of age: & then to be made free to all intents & purposes: And the term of Service of John, for which he is bound to me, & is unpaid, I give bequeath unto said Robert S. McCalla, who is to see that the said John at the expiration of the seven years for which he was bound be set free to all intents & purposes. Item: I give bequeath to my Niece Sally Hollinshead the Wages due of Doctor James Hollinshead, the Sum of Five Hundred Dollars. Item: I give bequeath to my Nephews William Robert, & Anson McCalla, & my Niece Jane M. McCalla, the works of such authors as they make choice of out of my Library: and the Remainder of my Library to be equally divided between Greenville College in Tennessee; and the Education Society of the Presbyterian Church in the United States; the one division to be delivered by my Executors to the Rev.^d Doctor Coffin for the first named Institution; & the other, to the Rev.^d Doctor Bird of Philadelphia, for the last named Institution. Item: I give & bequeath to my Niece Rachel English, my two plated Goblets. Item: I give bequeath to my Niece Hannah McCalla my plated Watch. Item: I give bequeath to my
