uncertainty of life do hereby make and declare this as
my last will and Testament. In premises I desire that my
body be buried in a most frugal manner without any
parade or ostentation and should I die in this City that
my remains be deposited under the Monumental Stone
of my family in the Cooper Churchyard. Item I give unto
my two youngest children Eliza M Lusher and Robert
M Lusher their heirs and assigns forever my house &
lot situate on East Bay Street known by the No 151 and
at present occupied by Mr N A Chen the rents thereof
to be equally divided between them share & share alike
Should my daughter Eliza aforesaid die without leaving
issue living at her death then her moiety or part of the
above property to belong to Joseph O Lusher for him and
his heirs forever and in the event of Joseph O Lusher aforesaid
dying without issue living, then the same to belong to the
issue of Robert M Lusher, and should Robert M Lusher
die without leaving issue living, the same to be divided a-
mong the issue of the surviving Brothers share and share
alike. Should Robert M Lusher die leaving no issue
during the lifetime of Eliza M Lusher

his heirs forever and in the event of Joseph O. Suster for him and
dying without issue living, then the same to belong to the
issue of Robert M. Suster, and should Robert M. Suster
die without leaving issue living the same to be divided a-
mong the issue of the surviving Brothers share and share
alike. Should Robert M. Suster die leaving no issue
during the lifetime of Eliza M. Suster aforesaid then
his moiety or part of the above property to go to her and
her heirs forever. whatever property I devise or bequeath to my
daughter Eliza M. Suster aforesaid is hereby declared
to be for her sole and separate use and benefit without
being in any way subject or liable to the debts contracts or
intermeddling of any future husband; And full power &
authority is hereby given to her to dispose of the same
by deed or will notwithstanding her coverture. Item
I give and bequeath to my daughter Eliza aforesaid, all
my wearing apparel jewelry watch & silver plate
(except the tankard) for her heirs and assigns forever
Item. I give and bequeath to my son Joseph O. Suster his
heirs and assigns forever my negro woman Kate with her
future issue. Item. My old family Bible, my negro
woman Philippa, and a silver tankard (which was

his Grand Father's) I give and bequeath to my son
 William D Lusher for his heirs and assigns forever
 Item My negro girl Jenny with her future increase
 I give and bequeath to my daughter Eliza with conditions
 before named. Item my house and lot in Queen Street
 I give and bequeath unto my sons William D Lusher
 Joseph O Lusher and Henry M Lusher for them and
 their heirs forever. Item My household furniture, and
 the residue of my Estate I give devise and bequeath unto
 my four sons William D Lusher Joseph O Lusher Henry
 M Lusher and Robert M Lusher share and share alike
 for them and their heirs forever Lastly I hereby nominate
 constitute and appoint my sons W D Lusher J O
 M Lusher and J O Lusher as executors to this my
 last will and Testament In witness whereof I do
 hereby set my hand and seal at Charleston SC
 this 1st day of May 1846 and in the 64th year of the
 Independence of the United States of America
