lately dead being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind

the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men
once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament which
is to say principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul
into the hands of God that gave it and for my body I recommend it to
the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner in the
discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but that all the good for
tion I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God
as touching such worldly estate where with it hath pleased God to
bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of it in the following
manner and forme. I give and bequeath unto
my sister one gold chain. Item I give unto my daughter
all my p^rsonall estate both equally to be divided amongst
ourselves as we are this morning and the same to be
distributed here before they are dead.
