 named, And in order thereto I have devised
 of land commonly known by the name of
 be sold by my Executors or others in that
 that it shall be sold for the sum of one hundred
 will is that the said half be paid to my wife
 and all my children to equal parts and shares
 and devise unto my wife and children and to the
 body lawfully begotten and to be born of me
 condition that he shall pay unto my wife and
 two thirds of what he shall receive of the said
 within the space of twelve months after the

 of my sons. Thirdly my will is that all my debts
 all my negro and white servants and bonds and all the

 other my children to each of them an equal share with descent
 to be made in twelve months after my decease by my Executors or
 -after named. Fourthly my will is that my wife
 wife for her sole use and benefit. I do hereby bequeath
 and appoint my dear beloved wife during her life
 and Mr. James Davis my son and son in law to be my
