like manner to be manmitted and set free the said Driver to con-
tinue on the plantation an act as Driver as heretofore and to be allowed
a Salary of Seventy five Dollars a year payable half yearly, the said salary

W. A. to continue as long as my Executors shall continue to employ him
as Driver. Item. I give and bequeath unto my loving Cousin
Charity Forrest my lot of land on Hassle Street now occupied by her
as a garden, to have and to hold the same during her natural life
and at her death the said lot of land to return to my Estate
and pass under the residuary clause of this Will. Item. I give
and bequeath unto my Executors and the survivors of them my
negro man Ben (the bricklayer) and Jacob (the carpenter). I trust
however to permit my loving Cousin Charity Forrest to have them
and receive the profits of the labour of said Slaves during her na-
tural life and from and after her death then on this further trust
and confidence that they shall cause the said negro man Jacob
to be manumitted and set free according to law - and that the said
negro man Ben shall go to the children of Robert and Charity
Wilson under the residuary clause of this Will; and my will
is that when Jacob shall be set free he shall be paid out of ^{my} Estate

to her & her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto Sarah Jane
Wilson, a negro girl named Dido (and sister to Betty) to her & her heirs
forever; Item I give and bequeath unto Thomas Harrison Wilson a

196. negro boy named London, to him & his heirs forever. Item I give
and bequeath unto William Hole Wilson a negro boy named Pickett
and I give and bequeath unto Latham Wilson a negro boy named
Jack to have and to hold to them and their heirs forever the said
three boys being the children of Mary at the Green Plantation. Item
I give to Captain Robert Wilson his note of hand on which a balance
(at the last payment) of about seven hundred Dollars was due. Item
after the payment of all my lawful debts and the legacies before
mentioned, I give devise and bequeath all the rest and residue
of my estate real and personal of whatever nature or kind the same
may be unto the children of Robert & Charity Wilson to them and
their heirs forever. Share and share alike, the said children to receive
their respective shares as they shall attain the age of twenty one
years or day of marriage, but should either of said children die
under age and unmarried then his or her share shall go to the sur-
vivors or survivor, and should all of them so die, the same to go to
their right heirs. It is hereby expressly declared to be my Wife and in-
tention should the said Charity and Robert Wilson have any other
child or children mutually begotten such child or children shall
take an equal share of the Estate herein devised to the children of
said Charity and Robert Wilson. Item. It is my wish that my
Plantation be continued in cultivation for five years and no
part of my Estate be sold during that time.
