

In the Name of God, Amen. I, Edward Roberts being
possessed of a good sense and perfect memory though much weakened
impaird in body by a disease wth daily tangitt upon me and considering
the frailty of mankind and how soon we are taken out of this present
world doe ordeyne and make this and only this my last will and
testament in manner and forme following. I Imprimis. I do give
and bequeath in case of my decease unto John Faulconer all and
every pte and pcell of land belonging or appertaining to me (that
is to say) the two hundred acres of land which I have taken up
marked and pitcht upon lying and being adjoining to the land of
M^r James Needham and adjoining to the river commonly called
Ashley river, and also I doe farther give and bequeath unto my
good friend John ffaulconer all that small patch of land pur-
chased by me and intended as a Towne lott containing by estimate
twelve poles be it more or less lying between the Towne lot of
Henry Wood, Carpenter, and Samuell Bopwood, Taylor, both
inhabitants in the sd Towne called Charles Towne. Item. I
doe give and bequeath unto John ffaulconer one crop cutt saw
wth one sett of Coop^r tools, one chest and all therein contained
besides all linnen and wearing apparell. And whereas I stand
Roberts being in dayly expectation of the arrivall of a ship from
Barbadoes and of things to be to me consigned or sent in the said
Ship I doe give full power to the above said John Faulconer to
take receive possess and enjoy all and every the said things if soe
sent or consigned to me and pther to keepe or dispose of the said things
as he shall thinke fitt. And this I doe declare to be my true and
last will and Testament and noe other. Witness my hand and
Seale this fourteenth day of October 1671.

Know all men by these presents that I Coll: William Sayle
Governor of that part of the Province of Carolina Southward and
Westward from Cape Carterett otherwise called Cape Roman
for and in behalf of the Lords Proprietors of the said Province
of Carolina having made my last will and testament in Bermuda
bearing date in the month of February last past w^{ch} said will I
doe by this present Codicill ratify and confirme Now being
in body but (blessed be God) in perfect mind and memory (for the
full disposeall of all my goods and chattels lands and tenements
disposed of in the said Will) I doe hereby give devise and bequeath
all that my Mansion house and Towne lott in Albemarle poyn
in the said Province of Carolina to my eldest Son Nathaniel
Sayle and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten and to be begotten
forever. Item. I doe give devise and bequeath all my other lands
and tenements goods & chattels w^{ch} shall be in my possession at the time
of my decease in the said Province and all the lands perquisites or
advantages due to me in the said Province of Carolina or any part
thereof by virtue of the concessions of the said Lords Prop^r or
otherwise unto my two Sonnes Nathaniel Sayle and James Sayle
and the heirs of their bodies lawfully begotten and to be begotten
forever. And my will and pleasure is that this Codicill or Schedule
be and be adjudged and taken to be a part of my last will and testam^{ent}
ment afores^d and to be of equal force wth the same. And I desire
the desire and require mine Execut^{rs} and Executors of the Executors
of my said last will that they doe cause all things in this Schedule or
Codicill contained to be faithfully performed according to my true
meaning as if the same were so declared in my said last will
and testam^{ent}. In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand

me the said Henry Woodward as one of the first settlers to the hon^{ble}
S^t John Yeammans Barst. he and his heirs. Item. What money
goods may or shall arrive in my behalf either from the said Proprietors or
any of my relations to the abovesaid S^t John Yeammans Barst. And
untill such time as the certainty of my death or returne be knowne
I doe constitute and appoigne the abovesaid S^t John Yeammans Barst.
my true and lawfull Attorney to receive and take whatsoever goods
may or shall arrive in my behalf in the abovesaid Province in my
name and for my use as if I were myself present And all that
he shall doe herein I doe ratify and confirme. Witness my
hand and scale. Jul: 17th 1671.
