The condition of this obligation is such that if the above bounden

do make or cause to be made a true & faithful Inventory & Apprais
of all & singular goods & Chattels Rights & Credits of s^d deceased as
far as they shall have knowledge of wth & truly & faithfully apprais
ed by three sufficient freeholders upon their oaths & the same under
their hands Return into s^d Governours office within ninety days
next after s^d date hereof And if s^d Admin^{rs} do well & truly
faithfully & pay all & every the said deceaseds debts so far as the
state amounts unto and if Law binds him to s^d R^{ts} Hon^{ble} of Lords
prop^{rs} & all other persons whatsoever as an Admin^{rs} ought to do
& if Law binds him s^d s^d Admin^{rs} do render an acc^t of his
Admin^{rs}hip when he shall so thereunto be required by s^d R^{ts} Hon^{ble}
of Lords prop^{rs} their Gov^{rs} & Council for if time being or to any person or persons
claiming any right or title thereto or to any of the said
things according to s^d Statute of 22. & 23. years of s^d reign of our late
sovereign Lord R^{ts} Charles 2^d Cap. 10. & if form of s^d condition then
contained as an Admin^{rs} ought to do & well & truly have humbly s^d R^{ts} Hon^{ble}
their Gov^{rs} & all other officers & ministers wth all persons whatsoever by words
or means of s^d Admin^{rs} being absent as afores^d then this obligation to be
void or else to remain in full force & virtue.
