At the Brig^d Cuttler's last will and Testament (vide bundle P. P. No: 23)
No 28 South Carolina. In the Name of God, Amen. I
Benj^{am} Beattell of Berkeley in the Province above mentioned Planter
being sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thank
be to God for it, and casting to remembrance the uncertainty of this life
do make constitute and appoint this my last will and Testament in
manner and form following, that is to say. first, I recommend my
soul into the hands of God my Creator hoping and assuredly be-
lieving the salvation of the same by the merits of Jesus Christ my
Redeemer and as for my body I commit to the Earth to be decently
buried in such manner as my Executors hereafter named shall
appoint and as touching what worldly estate it hath pleased
God to bestow upon me in this world I give and bequeath the same
in manner and form following, viz: ^{Impiuris} I will that
all my just debts and funeral expences be first satisfied and paid.
Item. I give devise and bequeath unto my loving wife Ann, to
her heirs and assigns (which shall be in lieu of her dower) ten
five slaves following viz: Bellah, Rosey, Jude, Joe and Caesar, and
also all my household goods. Item. I give and bequeath all
my land whereon I now dwell with a tract of pine land joyning
to Mr John Williams land, which said lands were laid out, some
by the Commissioners appointed by the Act of Parliament for the
dividing the land of my father John Beattell deceased amongst his
sons, as may appear by a Plat of the same, to be equally divided

between my two sons John and Benjamin by my Executors and Executors hereafter named as they or the majority of them shall think fit when my first son shall arrive to the age of twenty one years, and when my second son shall arrive to the aforesaid Age then he shall receive the remaining part of my said land and the aforesaid land so divided doe I give to my aforesaid sons and to their heirs and assigns forever. But in case my sons depart this life before they arrive to the age aforesaid or have heirs lawfully begotten that then and in such case I do give all my lands to my daughter Ann and to the heirs lawfully begotten of her body. Item I give and bequeath to be equally divided between all my children all the residue of my slaves, not already given away by this my will, in the manner following that is to say that at the marriage of my daughter all my slaves that then have and not already given away by this my will and those that shall be born in my said plantation belonging by my Executors shall then be divided between them by my Executors and Executors and after my daughter's death among such slaves the remaining part shall continue in the hands of my Executors and be divided between my sons when they shall come at the age of twenty one years and the aforesaid slaves between whom were born I do I give to my said children etc. the heirs forever and as to the residue and remaining part of my estate not before mentioned I give and bequeath to be equally divided between John and Benjamin by my Executors. Lastly I do nominate and appoint my wife Anne Williams and my loving son John Williams Executors and Executors to this my last will and Testament dooking hereby all the and same with a true mind and do acknowledge this only to be my last will and Testament and none other. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eight day of May in the second year of our said Sovereign and twenty.
