No. 48. Mr. Benj^t. Beattie's last will and Testament pride bundle R. B. No. 28)

In the Name of God. Amen. I
Benj^t. Beattie of Berkley in the Province above mentioned Planter
being sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thank
be to God for it, and calling to remembrance the uncertainty of this life
do make constitute and appoint this my last will and testament in
manner and form following, that is to say, first, I recommend my
soul into the hands of God my Creator hoping and assuredly be-
lieving the salvation of the same by the merits of Jesus Christ my
Redeemer and as for my body I committe the Earth to be decently
buried in such manner as my Executors hereafter named shall
appoint. And as touching what worldly estate it hath pleased
God to bestow upon me in this world I give and bequeath the same
in manner and form following vizt. Insipiris. I will that
all my just debts and funeral expences be first satisfied and paid.
Item. I give devise and bequeath unto my loving wife Ann, to
her heirs and assignes (which shall be lievin after her decesse) three
fine slaves following vizt Bellah, Rosey, Sude, Joe and Caesar, and
also all my household goods. Item. Give and bequeath all
my land wherow I now dwell with a tract of pine land joining
to Mr John Williams land, which said lands were laid out there
by the Economic Pioneers appointed by the Act of Parliament for the
dividing the land of my father John Beattie deceased amongst his
sons, as may appear by a Plat of the same, to be equally divided.

between my two sons John and Benjamin by my Executors and Executrix hereafter named as they or the majority of them shall think fit when my first son shall arrive to the age of twenty one years, and when my second son shall arrive to the aforesaid Age then he shall receive the remaining part of my said land and the aforesaid land so divided do I give to my aforesaid sons and to their heirs and assigns forever. But in case my sons depart this life before the arrival to the aforesaid age have been lawfully begotten that then and in such case I do give all my lands to my daughter Ann and to the heirs lawfully begotten after her body. Item. I give and bequeath to be equally divided between all my children all the residue of my slaves, not already given away by this my will, in the manner following that is to say that at the marriage of my daughter with my slaves that now have and not already given away by this my will and those that shall be born in my said daughter's lifetime so divided by my Executors shall then be divided between them by my Executors and Executrix and after my daughter's death remain such slaves the remaining part shall continue in the hands of my Executors and be divided between my sons when they shall arrive to the age of twenty one years and the aforesaid slaves so given before mentioned shall I give to my said children to have possession and to the residue and remaining part of my estate not being aforesaid slaves and bequeath to be equally divided between them by my Executors. Lastly I do nominate and appoint my wife Anna and my loving brother William Cattell and his wife to be my Executrix and Executor to this my Will and Testament bearing hereby all the power and authority as my executors and Administrators herby this only to be my sole executors and Administrators and none other. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighth day of May anno Domini MDCCLXXVIII in the year of our Lord two hundred and twenty.
